

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am grateful to have an opportunity to write to you about the Catholic Parishes Campaign (CPC) and the good work made possible by this annual appeal for the Diocese of Evansville.

The Diocese of Evansville is our local Church, which is made up of 45 parishes across 12 counties in southwest Indiana. We are blessed beyond measure to have such a wonderful community made up of people of many races, ethnicities and backgrounds. This rich diversity is a source of our strength, a strength which has at its foundation the love of Jesus Christ and our unity as His sisters and brothers

Last year when I wrote about the Catholic Parishes Campaign, we were all filled with anticipation of celebrating our 75th anniversary as a diocese. We began that celebration last November with the beautiful celebration of the dedication of St. Benedict Cathedral. Just a few months later, we were sheltering at home and public Masses were suspended due to the severity of the COVID-19 pandemic. It appeared that darkness had overtaken the land, and a multitude of unforeseen troubles and problems were suddenly ours.

However, our faith in Jesus united us and His love and grace held us together in spite of the tremendous challenges the virus placed in our path. Our diocesan offices worked closely with parishes to help them navigate these unprecedented circumstances as they continued pastoral ministry and outreach despite the lockdown. We experienced in those difficult days that, without any doubt, Jesus is our light that dispels the darkness. Our words were those of the ancient Te Deum prayer, "In you, Lord, is our hope, and we shall never hope in vain."

The Resurrection — Hope in Christ after Darkness is the theme of our appeal this year. This theme reminds us that the darkness of Jesus' passion and death on the Cross led to the light of the Resurrection, the fulfillment of God's promise to save His people. At our baptism, we received a lighted candle to remind us that as his brothers and sisters, we are filled with His risen light, and with His grace, we can work to dispel the darkness that can seem to surround us.

This is the good work that is done by the many ministries of the diocese as we strive toward accomplishing our mission of bringing the light and hope of Jesus Christ to His people. These ministries — Worship, Catholic Charities, Vocations, Hispanic Ministry, Catechesis, Catholic Schools, Family and Life, Youth and Young Adults, Communications, Tribunal, Stewardship, Finance, and Chancery — strive to serve the many and varied needs of parishioners, staff, and clergy of all our parishes.

Due to the ongoing economic difficulties stemming from the effects of the pandemic, the goal for the Campaign was not raised from last year. As a result, diocesan salaries were frozen and directors were asked to cut their budgets by 10%.

This Catholic Parishes Campaign is the primary means of financial support for the ministries of our diocese. Your financial support is crucial to the success of our mission as a diocesan Church. We are grateful to you for your extraordinarily generous contributions to this appeal in the past, and we are asking you to prayerfully consider contributing to it again this year, if you are able.

Be assured that I remember you and your intentions at Mass each day, and I ask that you remember me in your prayers. Let us ask the intercession of our patroness, Mary the Mother of God, to help us bring the light and hope of Jesus to all people.


The **Catholic Parishes Campaign** serves all those in the local Church, which is the Diocese of Evansville. Our local Church is:


- 5,010 square miles in size;
- 75,838 registered Catholics out of a total population 512,393;
- 45 parishes;
- · 36 active diocesan priests;
- 23 retired diocesan priests;
- 7 priests from religious orders and places outside the diocese;
- 209 religious sisters;
- 60 permanent deacons;
- 10 seminarians
- 2 Catholic hospitals
- 4 Catholic high schools with 1,431 students enrolled;
- 22 Catholic elementary schools with 5,589 students enrolled

In addition, in the last year there were:

- 887 baptisms of children;
- 71 adults baptized and 115 received into full communion with the Church;
- 297 marriages;
- 793 funerals.

This relationship with the Lord sustains people in their lives and faith in Jesus, empowering each of us to carry Christ into the world and encounter his people. We are meant to be the person of Christ for others.

Profiles in Faith
